



Average Annual Precipitation in California






Pumps and Canals Remedy Geographic Imbalance

Reservoirs Remedy Temporal Imbalance








Winter Flows 2014/15




Theoretical CWF Operation (1/5/16 – 2/10/16)


SWP Allocation of Recent Years



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
